Through your selfless acts and generous contributions, we were able to meet our 50th Anniversary goal of \$20.0 million. This money will directly benefit all Kansans and Kansas Communities through all the new programs. In response to the 2020 Covid-19 pandemic, your Foundation responded by developing and funding a new program to immediately help Brothers and Widows—The Almoners Fund. Also, this year the Foundation underwent a thorough review of all current programs, ensuring that the appropriate funding is being allocated and that we are good stewards of your money and financial resources. As part of this process, the Foundation increased its available Matching Funds for Masonic Lodges from \$1,000 to \$2,500 annually. This will continue to help our Lodges raise their visibility within their local community by providing important charitable funding. To ensure this important program will have the required funding for the future, the Kansas Masonic Foundation Board of Trustees has established a new \$3.0 million endowment. When this new endowment is fully funded, it will have the necessary funds identified to support this important Lodge Program for perpetuity.
